

Inaugural Earth to Sky Academy

Launching a National Network of Regional Communities of Practice in Climate Science and Communication

October 21-25, 2019 | NASA Goddard Space Flight Center

- Four teams attended: from Idaho, SE Alaska, Oklahoma, and the Upper Delaware River. The 17 participants work for federal, state, and local agencies, universities, tribal organizations, and NGOs.
- NASA GSFC scientists shared their research on fire, ice, hydrology, Earth systems, and land cover/use; NOAA and Washington College staff presented on sustainability.
- Content also included the successful ETS training and partnership building methodologies.
- Landsat, IceSat2, GPM, and GLOBE outreach staff shared hands-on and citizen science activities.
- Each team presented a draft plan to conduct a regional climate science and communication workshop and to support their communities of practice with NASA content.
- ETS will mentor the teams and provide follow-up distance learning along with connections to NASA content and staff.
- Planning for the next ETS Academy is underway.
